

hate crime: criminal offense against a person or property motivated in whole or in part by an offender's bias against a race, religion, disability, sexual orientation, ethnicity, gender, or gender identity 1

Trends in hate crimes

It should be noted national data on hate crimes varies and are inconsistent. FBI **national-level** data only goes through 2015.2 However, it indiciates that it did increase **6.8%** from 2014, largely due to an **increase in attacks on Muslims.** 3.4



Hate crimes in Orange County increased 14% in 2016 from 2015 and hate incidents in Orange County increased 67% with spikes particularly in November and December 2016 after the election. 5

The number 88 references "Heil Hitler" because "H" is the eighth letter of the alphabet.

The number 14 refers to a 14word mission statement: "We must secure the existence of our people and a future for white children."



The "not equal" sign is an attempt to claim that different races are not equal to each other (and to imply that the white race is superior).



Pepe the frog is used by the "alt-right" to portray racist and anti-Semetic sentiments, but look at the context of the meme as the use of the frog itself does not mean the person is a racist.

FGRN

FGRN is a Ku Klux Klan acronym for "For God, Race and Nation," a common Klan slogan.



SS bolts are a common white supremacist symbol derived from the Nazi-era symbol for the Schutzstaffel (SS)
