Here are a few suggestions:

1] Work with Church and religious organizations. They are already in the communities and have credibility. Find out the local Churches in HB that serve the community there. Offer to provide information and to be a line for communication for honest, accurate updated information.

2] Reach out to the various postsecondary institutions that could have Dream Act/DACA students to see what kind of support that you can offer and to visit with them in any information meetings or gatherings. You may have to search web sites and blogs to find these. In the OC, the administration may not want to “get involved”.

3] Social media – all of their kids are on the net. Be creative.

4] Spanish language media – even to take out an advertisement and see about providing a list of friends & supporters.
